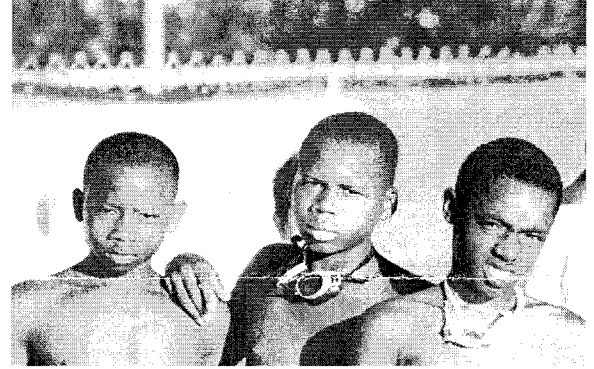

Dear Family and Friends,

THE OAKS is World Impact's West-Coast camp that we take our kids to each summer. The four weeks of camp for kids from first grade to twelfth grade is a major part of the summer ministry. It is a blessing to have this camp to take our kids to as THE OAKS does all of the programming, and we are able to just work on relationships with the campers. This year Glen attended junior-high camp with several of his Sunday-school kids. Glen was, honestly, a little nervous about the week because out of the eight boys attending, six can be difficult. Most of them had been to camp for several years, and they were always quite the challenge with seemingly little fruit. He knew that it was going to be a tough week at camp.

Even during this time you could see a battle raging inside him. He did calm down, and we able to return to the group. Not long after that, during the commissioning service while the speaker was talking, Terrance had a sweater over his head, and we thought that he was not listening. However, as soon as the speaker gave an invitation to come forward if they wanted their lives changed, he was the first one to come forward. He was crying, and the whole cabin came around him to pray for him.

On the way home, Glen asked him why he went forward. Terrance said he wants his life to change, and he wants to be a Christian. When Glen asked him if he is sorry for his sins, he said yes. He also said yes when Glen asked him if He asked Jesus to forgive him of those sins--amazing results from a week of camp to which Glen was not looking forward! God is faithful, even when we do not have the vision we should.
