I will share a little bit of the highlights of this first block in this letter. But one of the things I decided I needed to do for me was to do a little bit of decorating in my classroom. First Block Highlights

In my 7th grade class, I am teaching World History. We started this semester with the Renaissance. I shared in my last update about their "Be Like Michelangelo" assignment and some of their artwork. They all did an amazing job. I also had them "experience" the life of a scribe before the printing press. I gave them several Google Slides of information that they had to copy exactly as they saw it on the slide. And I did things like indented paragraphs differently, underlined words, cAPitaliZEd words in unusual places. There were about 6 slides they had to copy during a 20 minute period of time. Then they had a reflection activity they had to do. Here are some of the questions I asked with my favorite responses.

How did you feel while doing this activity?

I- felt very tired and thinked that my hand will fall off.

-My hand was like on fire.

-AGONY. My hand felt bad. I was worried I would do it wrong.

-I had so, so, so much fun! I loved how we got to experience how people before the printing press felt. I think we should get to experience what happened back then more.

-I felt those 20 minutes lasted forever.

What was easy about this activity?

Nothing was easy

What was difficult about this activity?

Something hard was not giving up at times.

What do you think life as a scribe was like?

-I think it was a very hard life for a scribe because I only wrote like 2 paragraphs but the scribe had to write a book so I guess their hand hurted very much.

-Oh, that is sadness and hard because a little mistake will let him do whole work again.

Without looking back, what do you remember about Johannes Gutenberg?

Nothing, I was too focused on copying correctly.

In my 8th grade United States history class, we looked at Andrew Jackson. They had to look at several events that happened during his presidency and decide was he "Heads or Tails". Heads is "democratic, sophisticated, saint." Tails is "autocratic, atrocious, savage". We looked at things like the Spoils System, Trail of Tears, Universal Male Suffrage, things that he vetoed (bank and Maysville Road) and the Nullification Crisis with South Carolina. I was really impressed with their thoughts as they looked this events and decided how they felt about his presidency.

In my 8th grade Philippine history class, we looked at the Filipinos fight for independence and how they struggled to be unified in their efforts. Again as we looked at the idea of unity and how important that is for an independence fight, I was very impressed with their critical thinking.

One of my favorite times of the week is Friday's Advisory class. I co-lead a group of 9 seventh grade girls. This is a time of spiritual encouragement, checking in with the girls and other fun activities. This is a non-academic class and is just a time to chat. It usually goes for about 1 hour or sometimes 1 1/2 hours. I love being able to just talk with the

girls and just have fun with them. I included a picture my co-advisor made of our group. I have really grown to love these girls.
